Emma: My name is Emma, and it is the 9th of March 2020 and we are here in Pencaitland Primary School. Please introduce yourself.

CC: My name's Christine Campbell.

Emma: Could you tell us a bit about your life when you were a child?

CC: When I was younger and I wasn't at school, I used to do horse riding. I used to do a lot of show jumping.

Emma: And did the horse have a name?

CC: Yes, Sherif.

Emma: How do you think children's lives are better or different now? Are they any better or worse, and why do you think that?

CC: I think they are worse now because they have too many game consoles, too many computers, too many mobile phones, and not enough play time outside with their friends.

Emma: Well I'm not guilty of that cos I don't have a phone.

CC: Do you not?

Emma: Nope!

CC: Oh dear!

Emma: So... Why did you choose to live in East Lothian?

CC: Erm, Ah probably didn't have a choice – my parents probably chose for me to live here!

Emma: And did you live anywhere else?

CC: Ehm... no!
